

Urgent: Priority '0': If your clinical assessment of the patient is they require review ASAP in a specialist clinic you need to **first discuss this with the relevant Registrar** via switchboard on **9431 3333** and then Fax the referral, clearly marked **URGENT** and **stating the name of the Registrar you have spoken to** with any attached reports to Fax **9431 2009**. Please ensure that the Fax header clearly identifies

- patient name;
- clinic referred to;
- appointment date; and
- total number of pages.

The Registrar may also request a referral be faxed directly to the clinic if your patient will be attending within 48 hours. Please also send the original by post marked with **FAXED** including date that it was faxed.
